**Purpose:** The purpose of the Recreational Vehicle Policy is to establish procedures for the safe use of kinetic/battery powered devices. The goal is to reduce the risk of injury to both user and campus community members, prevent damage to College property, and prevent disruption to campus operations or programming.

**Scope:** This policy applies to all users of recreational vehicles on College property.

## **Definitions:**

<u>Recreational Vehicles</u>: Includes, but is not limited to, skateboards, roller skates, roller blades, hoverboards, self-balancing boards/scooters and human powered cycles (bicycles, unicycles, etc.).

## **Operation:**

The use of recreational vehicles shall be permitted, only as a means of transportation and not for recreational purposes, on walkways and other vehicular travel ways. Operators of these devices must comply with the following procedures:

- 1. Users must give right of way to any pedestrian or motorized vehicle (including wheelchair operators).
- 2. Users must travel at all times at a reasonable, safe, and prudent speed.
- 3. Users must obey all campus stop signs and other vehicular instructions.
- 4. Recreational vehicles may not be used on ramps, curbs, benches, steps, or stairs and other such structures or property not explicitly designed for transportation.
- 5. Recreational vehicles are not permitted to be used inside any building or structure.
- 6. Storing and charging of <u>hoverboards</u>/battery powered recreational vehicles is prohibited in any building on campus.

## **Enforcement**

Ursinus College is private property, and all campus visitors are responsible for following college policies and procedures. Visitors who fail to follow this Policy will be asked to leave the college property. Failure to comply may result in further action by a college official and/or the Collegeville Police Department. Violators may be banned from campus and charges imposed for any damages caused by violation of this Policy. Violators returning to campus without written permission from the Director of Campus Safety may result in an arrest and charges for trespassing.

Violation by an employee or student may result in disciplinary action and charges imposed for any damages caused by a violation of this Policy.
