Sophomores:

As a sophomore, you are very likely to be in your career exploration phase. This step involves translating your findings about your interests, values and aspirations into a major and possible career. Internships are a great way explore your interests.

Remote internships will be accepted for Summer 2020. Updates have been made to <u>student materials</u> to outline the parameters regarding these remote experiences. Please note that students are able to earn credit for remote internships, but are not required to seek remote experiences, and they can still pursue in-person internships. Virtual environments may cause stress for some students who prefer the structure related to a concrete location and in-person contacts. And some types of experiences may not easily adapt to a virtual setting. In those cases, students can consider internships in fall, winter, or spring.
